5. Discussion and action on award for Automatic Meter Reading Project funded from Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWSRF) loan and grant money. After much discussion between Council and KSA, it was determined that the drive by AMR system would be a better fit for the city. The drive by system as a whole cost less than the fixed based system and also required less maintenance cost.

Maggie Majors-Spoke on intervention, budget over site committee, business ventures, local talent, need of industry, not closing library. Ok with 10-12% increase on tax.

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- 7. Discussion on 2014-2015 City of Marlin Budget.
  - Mr. Fletcher explained to the public the reasoning for the tax increase. In addition he indicated to Council that the new budget also included an increase to the debt service fee in order to comply with the requirement with the Texas Water Development Board contracts. It also includes a decrease in the amount transferred from the Water Fund to the General Fund for administrative charges as well as a decrease to the funding for the library. There is also a decrease in Fire personnel.
- 8. Second Reading: Discussion and action on Ordinance No. 14-021 Marlin Community Initiative. Councilmember Morin made motion to approve Ordinance No. 14-021.
