Police Sergeant Opening

Description

Police Sergeant: Under the general direction of the Chief of Police, will directly supervise and coordinate the daily operational activities of a patrol shift. Act in a command role in the absence of the Police Chief, instruct subordinate officers in patrol methods, code of criminal procedure, and report writing. Provides direction and assumes command of major incidents. The position is accountable for the effective operation and supervision of assigned staff. The selected individual must have successfully completed the basic police academy, pass the TCOLE exam, and must satisfactorily complete a basic reading and writing exam and review board. The sergeant becomes a non-probationary supervisor upon completion of six months of service to the Marlin community. This is a full-time position that is focused on police education, enforcement, and Community Oriented Policing. The City offers excellent benefits including paid holidays, vacation/sick leave, health, dental, life, disability insurance, and TMRS retirement. Pay rate of \$21.84 hr., uniforms and equipment provided.

Candidates must undergo a thorough background investigation and pass an interview, a medical exam, drug screening and psychological exam.
